Could you provide me with a link to the Q&A?

As mentioned during the conference calls, EPD is using email as the primary method for distributing information because there is an inherent delay in getting information posted on our website. The web link is <http://www.adoptabus.org/html/ARRATSEgrantpage.htm>.

Is the electronic spreadsheet application that was provided on the CD the entire application?

Yes, you only need to complete and submit the electronic spreadsheet on the CD. The spreadsheet application was also emailed as part of the request for applications.

Do I need letters of interest from listed truck stops included with the submission or is this assumed with their listing on the form?

No, you don't need a letter of interest from the listed truck stop. There is an assumption that the applicant has secured some reasonable form of agreement that allows install of TSE at the selected site.

The application listed several forms (eg., E-Verify, Immigration & Security form; Fed. Certification & Disclosure, and EPA Form 5700-49). They looked like they need to be completed after there is an award. Is this the case or are there any that need to accompany the application?

You are correct, additional forms may be completed later. An award winner will need to sign a memorandum of agreement (MOA) within 30 days of receiving the MOA. The MOA will be used as a tool to assure all federal and state laws are met, which includes providing all the required forms.

Is the \$299,200 referenced in the Minimum Requirements section the upper funding limit for each location? Is the \$299,200 what a vendor will be paid after matching dollars?

Yes, the DNR grant criteria limits the grant awards per project (i.e., location) to a maximum of 40% of the available \$748,000, which is \$299,200.

Yes, the \$299,200 is the maximum amount of “grant” funding that would be paid to a vendor for any one project (i.e., location).
